



Lodge/Chapter Leadership

- Attends all meetings and functions of the lodge
- Always wears the Scout uniform properly
- Sets the example
- Is prepared for meetings and presentations
- Gains consensus of the leadership team on all lodge decisions and goals
- Follows the responsibilities of the job

Lodge Executive Committee

- Youth Officers
- Youth Operating Committee Chairs
- Handles business of Lodge
- Advisers help guide/mentor

Lodge Organization

- Operating Committees:
 - Number depend on Lodge size
 - Chairs appointed by Lodge/Chapter Chief
 - Advisers appointed by Lodge Adviser
 - Promotes the purpose of the lodge
