Theme Connection:

TRAINER PREPARATION

Introduction 5 minutes

Briefly, introduce yourself and have each Arrowman introduce them (name and lodge)

What is Retention? 5 minutes

When we are talking about Membership Retention, it is the PERCENT of Youth Arrowmen who paid dues last year AND pay dues this year. Give the example below (it builds on the slide):



At the end of 2017, lodge youth membership is 1000 In 2018, 725 youth pay their dues Retention: 72.5% (GOLD JTE) (Mention that this is Gold JTE)

What is JTE (Journey to Excellence)

5 minutes

A National program that emphasizes continuous improvement.

Recognizes each level of the organization (unit, district, council), the OA's program creates Journey to Excellence recognition for chapters, lodges, and sections.

Trainer Instructions: Let everyone know that it changes each year to continuously challenge the lodges to improve themselves. Not every lodge is expected to attain Gold. If we all did, it was too easy.

There is an

example of what the JTE worksheet looks like in the final build.

What is Retention (continues)

5 minutes

Talk about the difference between membership growth and membership retention portions of the JTE worksheet.

Is Retention Important?

10 minutes

Ask why retention is important. The answers should include:

Trainer Instructions: Write the answers on the dry erase board or the flip chart

- It lets you

know if the youth like the things that your lodge does

- Retention shows that Arrowmen are connected to the OA
- It shows that the OA is connected to the Arrowmen
- If our old members don't want to join, why would new members want to join?

Can we impact Retention?

5 minutes

Ask what kind of impact that we can have on retention. Write down the answers, but then simplify them with:

Positive and Negative

How can we have a positive impact on retention?

10 minutes

Ask the question above. The answers should include:

Trainer Instructions: Write the answers on the dry erase board or the flip chart

Membership

Keep 'em Coming Back for More



- Ceremonies
- Program
- Elangomats / Nemats
- Service
- Fellowship
- Engagement
- Fun

For 5 minutes, have them meet with someone who they do not know to exchange ideas of how they would include each of these items in their weekend events.

Takeaway Challenge

3 minutes

Write a letter to your Lodge Chief or Adviser (or to yourself if you are one of the above) to ask that three of the above items (be extremely specific) could be incorporated into your weekend events and describe how you would do it.
